

Welcome to Accra, Ghana!

Thank you for prioritizing the 2026 APN Assembly!

We are pleased to welcome you to the 2026 APN Assembly, taking place from 2nd to 6th November at the [ALISA HOTEL](#) in Accra, Ghana. The venue is conveniently located about 6 kilometers from Kotoka International Airport. All participants are expected to arrive on Monday, 2nd November, and depart by Friday, 6th November 2026. To help you plan your travels and enjoy your stay, please carefully read the logistical information below and follow the guidance provided.

We look forward to a meaningful, inspiring, and productive gathering with your participation!

Airport: All international participants will arrive at Kotoka International Airport, which is located 6 kilometers from the Hotel.

Visa Requirements: Most African countries do not require a visa to enter Ghana. However, for those who require visas, the organizers will issue a formal invitation letter to facilitate your visa application. Visit <https://gis.gov.gh/visas/> for information about visa requirements.

Travel and Entry into Accra, Ghana: The designated point of entry and departure is the Kotoka International Airport. You are reminded to have the following items with you before you leave for the airport:

- Return air ticket
- Valid passport
- Valid Ghana entry visa, if your country is eligible
- Valid yellow fever vaccination card
- Name of the hotel for your accommodation.
- Invitation letter issued by the organizers

Airport transfers: Transfers have been arranged for all participants staying at ALISA and other designated Assembly hotels. Please ensure you have coordinated with your hotel to obtain a confirmed reservation and share your flight itinerary with the hotel.

Airport Desk: The organizer will arrange for a receiving desk at the airport. For those staying at ALISA, there is a receiving office at the airport after you have checked out. For other hotels, you will need to look for the signpost with your hotel's name. Ushers will be there to help with your ease of transfer.

Self-Organized Transfers and Mode of Payment: If you are arranging your own transport, please note the following important details:

- A taxi or ride-share journey takes roughly 10 to 15 minutes, depending on traffic.
- Taxis typically cost between \$8 and \$10. More drivers prefer cash payment in local currency.
- Bolt services are also available

Currency Exchange: Ghana's currency of trade is the CEDIS, and credit or debit card transactions are widely accepted. We advise participants to carry some CEDIS for cash and local purchases. There is a Money Exchange Bureau available at the airport, an ATM at the Alisa Hotel, and many more around the city

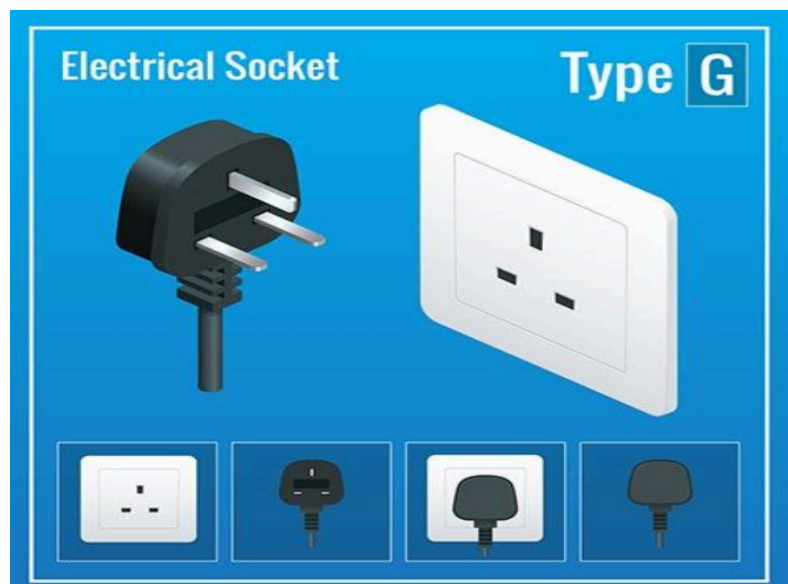
Accommodation: Arrangements have been made with Alisa and other hotels listed on the Assembly website. Please use the provided code to access discounted rates. Please note that all associated costs will be your responsibility. We recommend checking with the hotel at check-in about any incidental charges to avoid unexpected costs.

Registration of Participants: All participants will register at the Alisa Hotel on the 2nd of November and on the morning of the 3rd of November 2026.

Participants' Name Tags: You will receive a name tag that serves as your identification and an entry pass to the Assembly conference venues and organized events. Please keep it with you at all times.

Meals and Refreshments: You will be provided with complimentary mid-morning tea/coffee, lunch, and mid-afternoon tea/coffee break at the Alisa Hotel for the duration of the Assembly, from 3rd to 5th November. All hotels provide a bed-and-breakfast option.

Socket and Power Plugs: Please take note that hotels in Accra use the "type-G" sockets and power plugs, as provided in the illustration.



Internet Connection: All hotels will provide a complimentary wireless internet connection.

Weather: November temperatures typically range between an average daytime high of 30°C (86°F) to 31°C (88°F) and a balmy nighttime low around 23°C (75°F) to 25°C (77°F). It is a warm, muggy month characterized by high humidity and occasional light rain.

Health: There would be a nursing room and a healthcare provider available at the Alisa Hotel for any health needs. If there are any medical issues (such as allergies), please inform us by bringing the relevant information and medical insurance details to the APN Assembly registration desk.

Fitness: Alisa Hotel provides a gym and a swimming pool as part of the accommodation.

Security and Safety: Accra is generally a safe and welcoming city with a low risk of political violence. However, visitors and residents should exercise a high degree of caution due to increasing rates of street crime, opportunistic theft, and occasional violent robberies.
